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What should I expect on the day we sail?

As you know our travel styles differ.... I'll let you soak in her style and then I'll slide mine in on you. Love ya Charlotte!!!

OK I suggest being at the terminal at noon—you ask, because the party begins the moment you set foot on the ship!

Now, do have in hand when you get to the terminal your funpass, passport, ID, money for your ship and sail card and cash to pay the parking garage (roughly \$60). Keep these things in your carry on. Also in your carryon have sunscreen, a swimsuit, sunglasses, a good book, your bottle of wine, and your soda. Then give your luggage to the attendants, they will have it in your room and waiting when the cabins open at 3pm. By then you will be feeling very "happy" to be there.

In the terminal you will go through standard security, and present your papers several times and attest that you are not ill (physically not mentally). At the Carnival desk you will verify all the information on your booking and add money to your sail and sign card. From there you are whisked away to get your picture taken and then you climb the gang way to the ship. One more picture for identification just inside the ship's doors and LET THE PARTY BEGIN!!!

There will be music and a buffet waiting on the Lido deck. No waiting in the line for hours, no luggage to drag up the ramp—just you, your drink and the sea breeze for the next three days!!

The day we sailed was a somewhat hectic morning, or maybe that was just me getting excited about the cruise. Before you leave home, don't forget your Funpass paper work that you print online after your registration is complete. I arrived at the terminal, only getting lost one time, having to turn around after I realized I missed the exit in Mobile. Anyway, I parked my car on the top level of the parking garage and rolled my two bags to an elevator. Airport standards apply to your bag size and weight. I suggest carrying your bags on so that you will have them in your cabin for easier departure. Have your passport and ID ready immediately as you will be asked for it many times. The security lines were somewhat like the airport except you do not have to undress. You will come to a counter where an attendant will process your payment for incidentals that you purchase on the ship and you will receive your Sail and Sign card. You can't pay for anything on the ship with cash or credit card, you must put it on your Sail and Sign card.

When that is done you will proceed to the long ramp to the ship, but not before stopping and smiling for your FIRST picture. When entering your room you will be greeted by an animal or a bird made out of a towel, it could be a walrus, or an elephant or maybe a swan, either way, it's really cute!! Now get unpacked and either rest (heck, you can rest later) get out and explore the ship, as your Fun Time begins!!!!
